



Rosebud Theatre

History began in 1973 for the Rosebud School of the Arts when LaVerne Erickson, a fine arts teacher in Calgary, pioneered the Rosebud School of the Arts. Staffed by school teachers and fine arts college students, Rosebud drew young people, grades seven to 12 from across western Canada to its summer camps. The summer programs soon expanded into weekend retreats throughout the school year.

Thirty years later, the Village of Rosebud has become a community economic development success story. Over 40,000 visitors come to the small community each year to be entertained and have their spirits lifted at the Rosebud Theatre.

Earlier this year, the Rosebud School of the Arts unveiled the next chapter of their history in the form of a new \$1.2 million Rosebud Centre. The new centre will strengthen the economy of the entire region by promoting tourism, attracting corporate clientele and drawing additional visitors to Rosebud.

EnCana was pleased to come on board as a corporate partner by contributing \$150,000 towards the project. An additional \$50,000 has been committed towards the use of conference services once the new space is built.
